### **Did William Morris Start MacDonald Writing Fantasy?**

MacDonald does not however describe the shifts of Anodos’ mind, but subsumes them in the changes of his room, so that when they are complete he accepts that he is in Fairy Land But what is common to both MacDonald and Morris is the way both narrators are in a dream: when Anodos wakes in Fairy Land we know he is truly dreaming
